Ref. 34A	Letter from High Commissioner for Palestine to Mr. M. MacDonald (Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies), dated 21 <sup>st</sup> July 1939, 5 pages. Summary: German Consul-General has been informed that there is no objection to installation of Hellschreiber apparatus in the German Consulate-General in Jerusalem, under the condition that all received broadcast matter is exclusively for Consul-General's staff [i.e., not for further dissemination]. Intention to issue a license to the Consul-General. The Italian Consul-General at Jerusalem has also installed Hell apparatus at his Consulate-General, and has also been informed of no objections, under stated conditions.
Ref. 34B	Letter to Colonial Office, dated 25 <sup>th</sup> August 1939, 4 pages. Summary: the High Commissioner for Palestine in Jerusalem has drafted a license to be issued to the German & Italian Consuls-General, for the installation of Hellschreiber apparatus in the Consulate-General.
