Dear Information Officer.

In connection with the change from Morse to Hellschreiber worlding arrangements have been made to cease Morse transmissions to Europe by GHV 78 kilocycles after the transmission which terminates at 0315 GHT on Sunday 1st January 1950.

Hellschreiber transmissions only will be available from 0900 GMT on Monday 2nd January 1950. A graphic chart showing the times of transmission and times of reception at various areas is attached and it should be noted that there is no change in frequency. That is, 78 kilocycles will be used.

Horse transmissions by short wave to the more distant posts in Europe will continue for the present. Following are particulars:-
