Dear Carter

Your letter PG.19210/3 of 18th September.

Since receipt of the Hellschreiber we have consistently tried to get it operating satisfactorily here, but, as our periodic reports have informed you, without success.

When your last letter (of September 18th) was received, Chancery, who all along have been kept informed of the position, took over the Hellschreiber for a period of trial. Their results proved as unsatisfactory as our own had been, and they have now asked us to pass to you their recommendation that you send us an expert technician to study the problem on the spot. If practicable they suggest someone from Athens should come, or alternatively someone from London. I shall look forward to having your reaction to this "last-ditch" proposal.
